



DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE COMPOSITION


The institute has an efficient and eminently operative disciplinary committee that oversees and administers the compliance to the disciplinary code of the college. The committee is formed with the objective to ensure that there is proper compliance of rules and that discipline is maintained within the college premises that is vital for the smooth functioning of the college system. The code of conduct and disciplinary principles are displayed on the ______ and made as per Maharashtra Public University Act. The disciplinary committee is responsible for overseeing the conduct of the college and ensuring that all students adhere to it. The committee functions as per the SOP outlined below, keeping in mind the principles of natural justice.

The primary function of the committee is to inform and notify students of the code of conduct and to take disciplinary actions against cases brought to the attention of the committee. The committee takes all necessary measures to ensure that all disciplinary rules are followed in the college premises and any breach of the code of conduct that is laid out by the institute is dealt with strictly. The committee has a redressal committee that meets to address and resolve complaints received or for other general issues of disciplinary enforcement referred to it. The disciplinary committee's efforts play a crucial role in maintaining a functioning, efficient and an invigorating environment that promotes learning for all students and achieving the college's objective.

Standard Operative Procedure (SOP) of disciplinary committee.

<u>1.</u> The Disciplinary committee receives and addresses complaints that are submitted either orally or in writing, that deals with a student's conduct or behavior that violates the college's rules and conduct. Upon receiving a complaint, the convenor of the committee shall summon the heads and representative of the committee within 48 hours. They shall deliberate, review and resolve the issues within those hours.

2. To ensure that the complaint is authentic, the disciplinary committee shall conduct an inquiry to verify the veracity of the allegations. The process is elaborate to ensure that all issues are addressed adequately. The process involves interviewing witnesses or reviewing any evidence presented to the committee regarding the complaint.

3. If the complaint is substantiated, the Disciplinary Committee shall acknowledge the complaint and document it. Additionally, any details that are pertinent to the matter, such as the date, time, and location of the incident shall be documented.

4. The parties to the complaint, including the accused and any witnesses, will be invited to present their issues. During the hearing, the parties will be allowed to produce evidence or witnesses to support their case. The Disciplinary Committee will take note of the proceedings and any observations made.

5. Upon receiving the evidence and addressing the witnesses, the disciplinary committee shall summon both parties to a joint hearing, where the committee will seek to provide an opportunity for a fair hearing. The hearing



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will be conducted professionally and respectfully to provide a safe space to the complainant

6. Upon reviewing all the facts and evidence presented during the hearing, the Disciplinary Committee shall make its final observations and recommend appropriate disciplinary action to the principal. The recommended disciplinary

action may include suspension, expulsion, or any other disciplinary action deemed appropriate.


7. The findings and recommendations of the Disciplinary Committee shall be sent to the principal for review and approval. Upon receiving the report and review, the principal, shall meet with the Disciplinary Committee to discuss the findings and recommendations and to decide on the appropriate disciplinary action to be taken.

8. The Principal shall issue a notification of the disciplinary action to be taken, to the student concerned, detailing the nature of the offense, the disciplinary action taken, and the duration of the punishment. The parties concerned shall be notified of the outcome of the hearing, including any consequences that may result from violations of the college's regulations

9. Finally, a notice of the disciplinary action taken shall be displayed on the college notice board to inform the college community of the action taken so that it serves as a warning to others who may contemplate violating the college's regulations in a similar manner.



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
